EPA Research Prizes 2009

Our association has the pleasure to announce **five Research Prizes** with **two new categories**. **€ 2500** (two thousand five hundred euros) **prize** will be represented **to the winning authors of each of the five categories**. The Research Prizes 2009 seek **to award young psychiatrists, working in Europe**, who have published the best scientific papers in the year 2008 in the following categories:

- 1. Clinical psychopathology and refinement of psychiatric diagnostic categories**
 - 2. Biological correlates and treatments of mental disorders**
 - 3. Psychiatric epidemiology, social psychiatry and psychotherapeutic interventions in mental disorders**
- New categories:**
- 4. Child & Adolescent Psychiatry**
 - 5. New Diagnostic Approaches in Psychiatry: Relevance for Research and Practice in Europe**

ELIGIBILITY:

1. Working as a psychiatrist, or working in research in psychiatry, or being a resident in psychiatry in a European country.
2. Being less than 40 years of age (as of December 31, 2008).
3. Being the first author of a scientific paper published in the year 2008 in a journal indexed in the Current Contents, whose topic falls within one of the above-mentioned areas.

REGULATIONS: Applicants should submit their application file written in English fulfilling the above criteria and including the **[application form downloadable at EPA website](#) and following documents in 4 copies:**

- Curriculum Vitae
- Documentary evidence for being less than 40 years of age (copy of ID)
- A scientific paper in the field of one of the five prize categories published in the year 2008 in a journal indexed in the Current Contents
